# Master Plan projects are paying off

The news was surprising. The International Lilac Society discovered that Descanso had lilacs that may not be found anywhere else in the world. The garden has always been home to many special plants, but this came as a revelation. How does a garden protect and preserve lilacs that may be the last of their kind?

Descanso Gardens is not just a place of beauty. It is a symbol of Southern California's

distinctive landscape. It represents a delicate balance between curated horticulture and the untamed wilds of nature. For years, the garden balanced visitation with stewardship, and now faces new obstacles with a warming climate and water challenges.

These pressures prompted the leadership to make an important decision: Plan for the next 15 years with a vision that addresses both immediate concerns and long-term sustainability. The Master Plan for Descanso Gardens was approved in 2020, transforming challenges into solutions.

## A place to grow

One of the first projects completed from the Master Plan is the Ruth Borun Nursery and Propagation Center. The nursery, which opened in 2022, spans 25,000 square feet and features greenhouses measuring 6,000 square feet.

On a recent day, Frank Obregon, Nursery Horticulturist, and Taylor Lopez, the Ruth Borun Horticultural Intern, were at the nursery tending to the lilacs. There are hundreds of small pots containing lilacs all over the area, each marked with a name and

date. Obregon's work will make sure the lilacs are not lost. It is his mission to ensure that they are not only propagated but also shared with other gardens.

At the new nursery, the horticulture team has something they've never had before, space. The land—with its greenhouses, shade areas, and sunny glen—allows them to care for thousands of plants.

Along with the lilacs, the nursery is a place to propagate and care for Descanso's camellia collection, grow oak saplings, and nurture California native plants. The work at the nursery has also produced hundreds of milkweed saplings that are given to visitors for their gardens.



### A place for fun

While the collections are the heart of Descanso, it is also a place for families to connect and have a great time. The electric train rides have always been a crowd favorite, but the garden has taken things to the next level with the addition of the Descanso Railroad.

Located near Center Circle, the railroad includes a new station and whimsical model trains. What makes this railroad truly special is its connection to the natural world. Twice a year, we give it a new look with miniatures that are built using the very materials of the garden—twigs, bark, leaves, acorns, and pebbles. The themes range from the historical “Great Train Stations of America” to the quirky “Road Trip Across America.” The railroad is brought to life by Applied Imagination, renowned for its intricate botanical models and iconic G scale trains.

Opened in July of 2024, the railroad is already a hit with visitors and has been incorporated into the garden’s Carved and Enchanted events.

The Descanso Railroad and Ruth Borun Nursery and Propagation Center are just two of the exciting projects we have completed in the Master Plan.

### Investing in the next generation

This year, thanks to the generosity of our supporters, Descanso welcomed two interns.



Taylor was the first Ruth Borun Horticultural Intern, made possible by funding from the Anna and Harry Borun Foundation. She worked in the nursery named after Ruth Borun, a lifelong lover of plants, propagation, and education. Taylor spent six months learning how the gardens preserve and care for their collections.

“Participating in this internship has been nothing short of wonderful, and in some ways, life-altering,” Taylor wrote. “This has all been made possible through Ruth Borun’s legacy...I intend to use my new knowledge to honor Ruth. The beauty will always be for her.”

Collin Joe spent the summer working in the Sturt Haaga Gallery and with the program staff. As part of a summer internship for local students, generously funded by Brad and Vicki Schwartz, Collin worked on the *Hwajodo* exhibition and on designing materials such as glossaries, artist catalogs, and volunteer resources. He also participated in exhibit-related conferences, providing artistic insights for future installations.

“My experience at Descanso Gardens gave me my first look into guest services, communication between facilities, and most importantly, time management skills that I continue to apply in every job I take on,” he said.

# A welcoming garden

At Descanso, we are committed to making the gardens accessible to everyone. Through the philanthropy of our generous donors and supporters, we are able to offer free admission and programs, making it possible for more visitors to experience a meaningful connection to nature.

In 2024, we welcomed 57,799 guests with free admission, including EBT cardholders, students, educators, military

personnel, and members of the public during our monthly Free Tuesdays. During extended daylight hours, we stayed open until 7pm so more people could visit after their workday.

All buildings and many paths are accessible to visitors who require physical accommodation. Wheelchairs are available for loan, and a tram is available for gallery visits. Our Master Plan envisions a garden with more ADA-accessible paths and walkways.

# Fostering a love of nature

Our free school programs provided children with a sense of wonder, discovery, and off-trail exploration. They helped instill an appreciation of our natural world in our youngest visitors.

## Free field trips

The gardens hosted 12,372 students and adults on field trips, many of whom were from Title 1 schools. To further support the hands-on learning students experience during their visit, our education department offered pre- and post-visit lesson plans, along with expanded resources for both docent-led and self-guided field trips.

Transportation costs were a barrier for some schools to participate in field trips. To help overcome this challenge, we worked with funders to support busing and transportation expenses in the future.

In addition to field trips, we hosted four free days for homeschoolers, welcoming 1,677 children and their



instructors. We provided activity guides and educational resources, and allowed participants to explore nature.

## Art and nature

My Masterpieces: Discovering Art in My Community, a collaboration

between Pasadena Unified School District, the Pasadena Educational Foundation, and local cultural institutions, provides arts learning to students in nearby communities. As part of this initiative, Descanso Gardens offered a second-grade program that combined nature exploration with artmaking, helping students develop creativity, visual literacy, and observational skills. In 2024, 451 students participated in this program.

# Connecting with nature

Member and donor support allowed us to offer a wide variety of events, workshops, and classes designed to connect people with nature and one another.

Throughout the year, the horticulture staff led bloom tours, nature walks, and demonstrations to give visitors more insight into our plant collections and how we take care of them.

The natural backdrop of the gardens served as inspiration for several art classes and poetry writing workshops.

Guests come to Descanso for the health and wellness that spending time in nature provides. There were numerous opportunities to participate in wellness classes, including yoga, sound baths, and guided nature meditations.

We had monthly story times, crafts, and other age-appropriate activities that introduced our youngest visitors to the wonder of nature.

Our Summer Music and Dance series celebrated the rich history and traditions of several different cultures. With the help of Pacific Opera Project, we hosted live opera on the Main Lawn.

Guests were invited to six Cultivate events in the summer where they enjoyed music, dancing, and engaging experiences in nature.

We thanked our members for their support at two garden-wide exclusive celebrations.

Our signature events, Carved and Enchanted Forest of Light, continued to delight guests and provide the gardens with a valuable source of revenue.

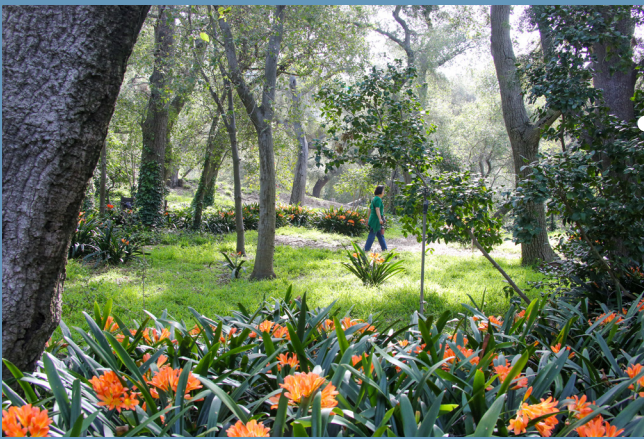

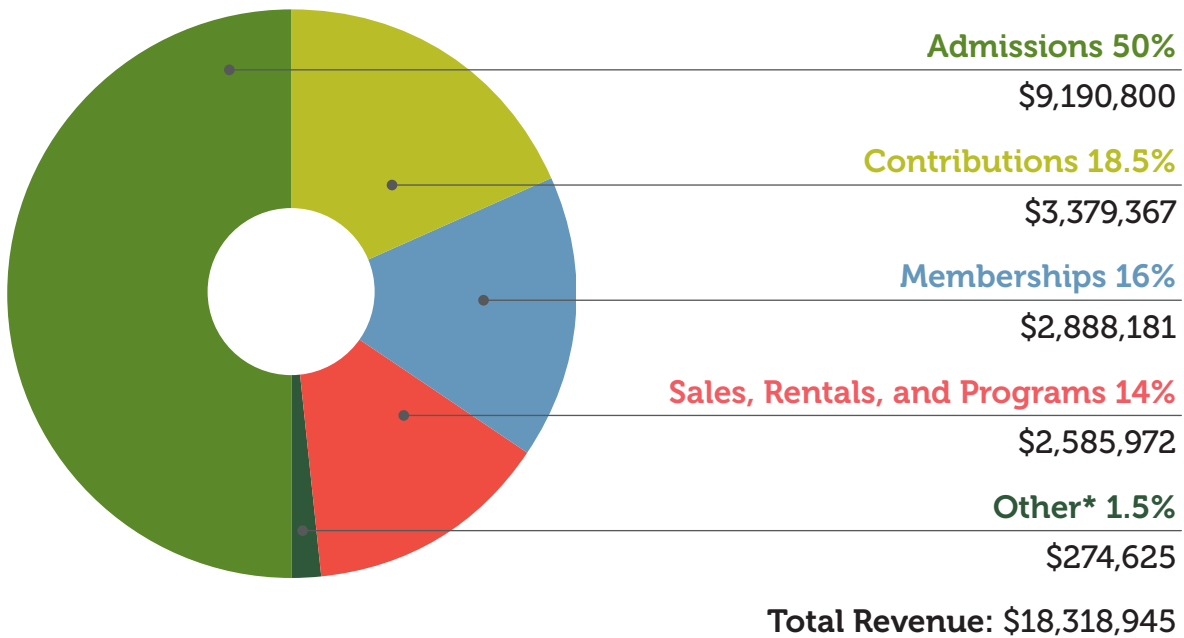

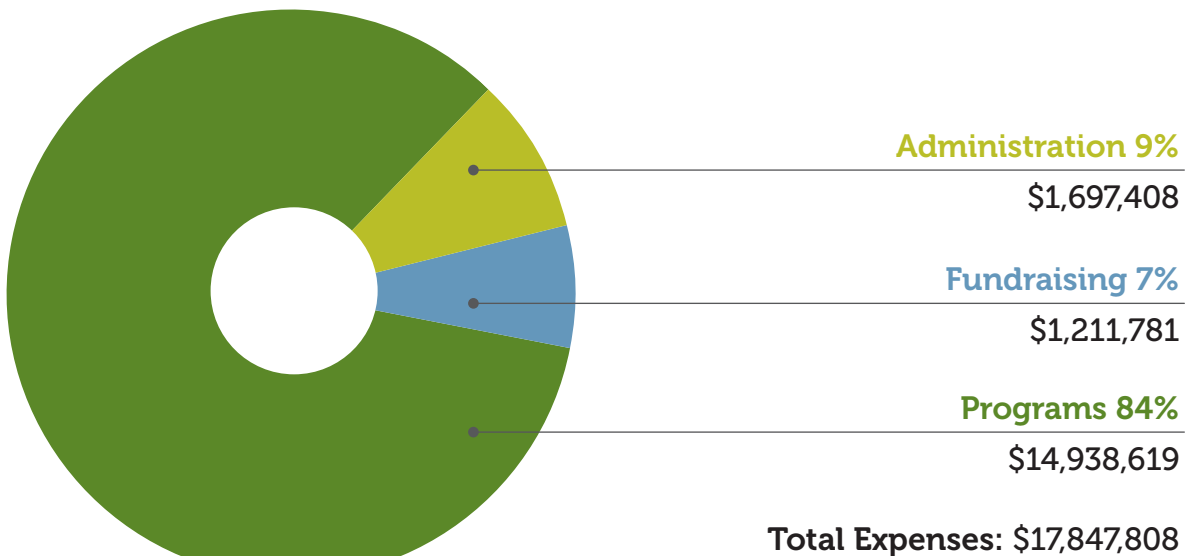

## **The Projects: Phase 1 of the Master Plan**

Thanks to the generous support of our donors and grant funders, we’ve already completed several major projects in Phase 1 and have several more starting in the near future.



### **Membrane Bio-Reactor**

#### **Completed in 2020**

The membrane bio-reactor is a critical source of water for Descanso. It partially replaced the gardens' septic system by making the wastewater suitable for irrigation and reducing the need to purchase water. It currently processes about 8,000 gallons daily which will increase to approximately 30,000 gallons per day once the Master Plan is completed.



### **Ruth Borun Nursery and Propagation Center**

#### **Completed in 2022**

The Ruth Borun Nursery and Propagation Center has been a game changer. We are now able to efficiently propagate the treasures of the gardens and preserve the genetic material of our camellias, lilacs, rare California-native plants, and oaks. It also supports our efforts to breed drought-tolerant and heat-tolerant plant varieties.



## CAMPAIGN FOR DESCANSO GARDENS



### **Descanso Railroad**

Completed in 2024

This new garden space gives guests of all ages a dedicated place to board the beloved ride-on train and provides a more engaging train experience. The project includes a new electric ride-on train, loading platform, and multi-level miniature train display.



### **The Market & Farmhouse at Descanso Gardens**

Completed in 2025

With the increase in visitorship, we had to rethink our guest amenities. The Market, opened in 2023, offers grab-and-go hot and cold food. Farmhouse offers a fine dining experience, with a menu designed by farm-to-table pioneer Chef Rich Mead. The interior features an indoor/outdoor bar and tables constructed from Descanso's coast live oaks that fell during the rainstorms of 2023.

### **Camellia Strolling Garden**

#### **Ongoing**

A cornerstone of the garden's rich horticultural history, the camellias will be organized to showcase their significance and honor those who have cultivated them. A dedicated trail will guide visitors through the collection, featuring educational and interpretive elements that highlight the cultural, botanical, and historical importance of these iconic blooms.



### **Stormwater Capture**

#### **Construction to begin in 2025-26**

This innovative project will reduce Descanso's purchased water use by 50% by capturing water from the Winery Creek Channel and storing it in a 1.5-million-gallon underground cistern for irrigation. The cistern will also provide vital fire suppression resources for both the gardens and the surrounding community.

### Lake Restoration

**Construction to begin 2025-26**  
Our lake is one of the most prominent and important water features in the gardens. It is also an important investment priority in the Campaign for Descanso. This project will restore the lake and its wildlife habitat, improve visitor access to it, and ensure that Descanso demonstrates excellent wetland preservation and water management for decades to come. In addition, the lake will serve as a critical fire suppression resource, providing an additional 1.5 million gallons of water to help protect the gardens and the surrounding communities.



### Nature Discovery Garden

**Construction to begin 2025-26**  
The 3-acre Nature Discovery Garden—equal parts discovery, play, and education—will foster exploration in nature. It includes water play, quiet contemplation, climbing features, a sensory garden with a learning pavilion, and a new restroom.

## Bringing the vision to life

Phase 1 of our Master Plan represents a bold investment in Descanso Gardens' future. With a total goal of \$65 million, this phase is being

funded through a diverse mix of public-private partnerships including government funds, corporate and foundation support, and individual philanthropic investment.
